ZONING ORDINANCE

An Ordinance enacted by losco Township under Public Act 110 of 2006, the Michigan Zoning Enabling Act, as amended, to regulate the use and development of land and provide for the establishment of districts within which specified land use and development may occur including restrictions and requirements for structures, buildings, yards, and development densities, and to establish a permitting system to ensure reasonable review and authorization of land uses and development including the issuance of permits, appeals of decisions, and penalties for violations.

THE IOSCO TOWNSHIP BOARD ORDAINS:

Article 1 TITLE and PURPOSE

Section 1.1 Title

This Ordinance shall be known and cited as the losco Township Zoning Ordinance.

Section 1.2 Purpose

- A. It is the purpose of this Zoning Ordinance to:
 - 1. Regulate the use of land and structures to meet the needs of the state's citizens for food, fiber, energy, and other natural resources, places of residence, recreation, industry, trade, service, and other uses of land in accordance with the land's character and adaptability.
 - 2. Ensure that the use of land is situated in appropriate locations and relationships.
 - 3. Limit the inappropriate overcrowding of land and congestion of population, transportation systems, and other public facilities.
 - 4. Facilitate adequate and efficient provision for transportation systems, sewage disposal, water, energy, education, recreation, and other public service and facility requirements.
 - 5. Promote public health, safety, and welfare including the conservation of property values and natural resources including wooded areas, wetlands, and water resources.
 - 6. Implement the goals, objectives and policies of the losco Township Master Plan adopted pursuant to the Michigan Planning Enabling Act, Public Act 33 of 2008, as amended.
 - 7. Advance all other purposes as authorized by the Michigan Zoning Enabling Act, Public Act 110 of 2006, as amended.
